Other Activities

ACT Government Liaison

- The Tourism Leaders Forum was invited to prepare a list of ideas to put before the Chief Minister and Chief Health Officer on how the commencement of a recovery process could be handled by our sectors.
- Members of the Tourism Leaders Forum met with Chief Minister Andrew Barr and also frequently with the Chief Minister's Tourism Advisors over a number of issues
- Members of the Forum met with ACT Liberal Leader Alistair Coe and Shadow Tourism Minister Andrew Wall prior to the ACT election
- Discussions were held with ACT Greens Leader Shane Rattenbury on tourism related matters
- Regular meetings were held with Visit Canberra and the Deputy Director General Chief Minister's Directorate on all matters under their respective portfolios



TOURISM LEADERS FORUM

- Discussions with Events ACT and other private event organisers were held to discuss issues relating to the streamlining of the events approval processes
- Summernats asked for assistance in seeking support for their event
- Funding of the Canberra Area Theatre (CAT) Awards was raised with the Leaders Forum
- Talks were undertaken with the Community Services Directorate on the National Multicultural Festival
- The National Arboretum and Stromlo Forest Park developments were discussed with General Manager Scott Saddler. A tour of the Arboretum was also undertaken by the Tourism Leaders Forum Board members
- Planning issues were raised with Access Canberra, Transport Canberra and Planning Minister Mick Gentleman and his advisors
- Meetings were held over several months with the City Renewal Authority on their Precinct Renewal Programs
- Discussions were held with Brand Canberra Board members and others on the potential tie in of the brand with tourism and allied sectors
- International Engagement Comm. Brendan Smyth initiated discussions on the ACT Government's overseas trade missions and tourism related issues.

Federal Government and National Issues

- Meetings were held with the National Capital Authority on a number of matters surrounding the Parliamentary Precinct and their involvement and contribution to tourism and the visitor economy
- Members also attended forums conducted by the NCA on brown signage and the redevelopment of Kings Park
- Attended meetings to support the National Museum of Australia's initiative in establishing the 'Culture Loop' bus shuttle service funded by the institutions to service the national attractions
- Meetings convened with Member for Canberra Hon David Smith MP, ACT Senator Zed Seselja and with Hon Ben Morton MP. Minister Morton's meeting was a follow up to his report on Canberra's National Cultural Institutions
- Discussions were then held with the Department of Communications relating to the Morton Report and the National Capital Education Tourism Project, and with the Federal Department of Communications re school visits to the ACT
- Austrade arranged forums on the development of a National Tourism Brand and were attended by a number of members of the Tourism Leaders Forum
- Discussions were initiated with Tourism Industry Council Executive Director Simon Westaway, Australian Chamber Tourism Chair John Hart, and Tourism and Transport Forum's CEO Margie Osmond.
- Johnathan Kobus, Michael Thomson and David Marshall participated in online 'Team Meetings' initiated by Australian Chamber Tourism on the proposed 'travel bubble' between Wellington and Canberra



Federal Government and National Issues (cont)

- Meetings were held with several National Institution Directors
- The Chair toured the AFP Police Museum with the NCA and then with ACT Police Minister Mick Gentleman to discuss the relocation of this facility to the Parliamentary Triangle, or onto ACT land

ACT Industry Sector Liaison

- Meetings have been held with the Canberra Business Chamber on tourism and related business issues.
- The Tourism Leaders Forum was represented on the Chamber's Kindred Organisations meetings and also Steve Wood represented the Tourism Leaders Forum on the Australian Chamber's Tourism Committee
- Through an initiative of the AHA ACT, the Tourism Leaders Forum jointly conducted pre-election forums in each ACT electorate, inviting local candidates to present their ideas and to directly hear the plight of ACT tourism and hospitality operators.
- Meetings were held with representatives of ACT Clubs on a number of issues impacting their financial viability
- Plans were viewed and discussed on the proposed Majura Valley tourism precinct
- Discussions were held with operators on the school excursion market covering accommodation challenges, seasonal visitation issues and visitation limitations to national attractions
- Property developers and investors briefed members of the Tourism Leaders
 Forum on current ACT planning legislation
- Meetings were held with Singapore Airlines and Qantas on aviation matters, with the ACT Brumbies and Raiders on a stadium for the city centre and ACT Arts groups on marketing and promotional support.
